

Barracudas win ninth consecutive league title

CLINTON, Mo. – For the last eight seasons, the Louisburg Barracuda swim team has ended its year with a South Suburban Swim League title.

The Barracudas weren't about to let No. 9 slip away from them.

Louisburg won its ninth consecutive title Saturday as it racked up 618 points to win the SSSL meet in Clinton, Mo. The Barracudas won the meet by an overwhelming margin as runner-up Harrisonville (Mo.) finished with 376 points.

Several individual swimmers also wrapped up a special season as they left the league meet with some hardware of their own.

Ashley Branine (9-10 girls) and Emma Prettyman (11-12 girls) each finished in first place in the high-point standings, while the Barracudas had seven other swimmers finish in the top three.

Casey Carpenter-Ross (8-and-under boys), Josiah McCaskill (9-10 boys), Remington Rice (13-14 boys) and Kadisyn Kircher (15-and-over girls) each finished runner-up in their

respective divisions. Claire Brown (11-12 girls), Mable Graham (13-14 girls) and Cole Brown (13-14 boys) took third overall in the high-point standings.

Prettyman finished her season strong as she won all five of her races during Saturday's league meet. She took first place in the 50-meter freestyle in 34.65 seconds, the 50 butterfly

in 38.22 and 200 IM in 3 minutes and 21 seconds.

Prettyman also won a pair of relays with the help of teammates Abby Bradley, Tehya Harvey and Claire Brown. The group finished first in the 200 medley relay in 2:57 and 200 freestyle relay in 2:37. Bradley also won the 50 backstroke (44.10).

As for Branine, she recorded four victories on the day, including two relays. Branine, Jesse Faulkner, Ally Brown and Hannah Farrington touched the wall first in the 100 medley relay (1:42) and 100 freestyle relay (1:28).

Individually, Branine won the 50 breaststroke (53.0) and 50 backstroke (46.50).

In the 15-and-over girls division, Madelyn Prettyman also picked up four victories for the Barracudas. Madelyn, along with Kircher, Kaitlyn Lewer and Avery Graham won the 200 medley relay (2:32) and 200 freestyle relay (2:18).

Madelyn also captured first-place medals in the 50 butterfly (30.31) and 200 individual medley (2:39). Kircher won the 50 backstroke (35.93) for her third victory.

On the boys side, Carpenter-Ross, Samuel Johnson (9-10), Rice and Cole Brown each won three events.

Rice and Brown teamed up with Bridger Baus and Drake Burdine to win the 200 medley (2:49) and 200 freestyle (2:26) relays. Rice came in first in the 50 freestyle (30.43), Brown won the 50 breaststroke (50.20) and Baus won the 50 backstroke (39.22)

Carpenter-Ross hit the wall first in the 25 butterfly (22.72) and 200 individual medley (4:11), and later joined Colin Brown, Noah Sharp and Andrew Jamison to win the 100 freestyle relay (1:32).

Johnson, Colton Prettyman, Conor Aadland and McCaskill swam to victory in the 100 freestyle relay (1:19) for the 9-10 boys. Johnson later won the 50 freestyle (37.12) and 50 backstroke (44.5). McCaskill was victorious in the 50 breaststroke (49.81).

Barracudas complete perfect regular season

RAYTOWN, Mo. – The Louisburg Barracudas completed a perfect sweep of the South Suburban Swim League on Saturday when it traveled to face off with the Woodson Sharks.

The Barracudas had no problems with the Raytown, Mo., team as it rolled to a 344-173 victory over the Sharks to finish their regular season with a 4-0 record and will go for their ninth straight league title this Saturday when they travel to Clinton, Mo., for the finals meet.

Louisburg had four swimmers that won all five of their events and three more that captured four victories on the day.

Ashley Branine (9-to-10-year-old division) and Emma Prettyman (11-12) won five events on the girls side. Casey Carpenter-Ross (8-and-under) and Josiah McCaskill (9-10) grabbed five first-place ribbons for the boys.

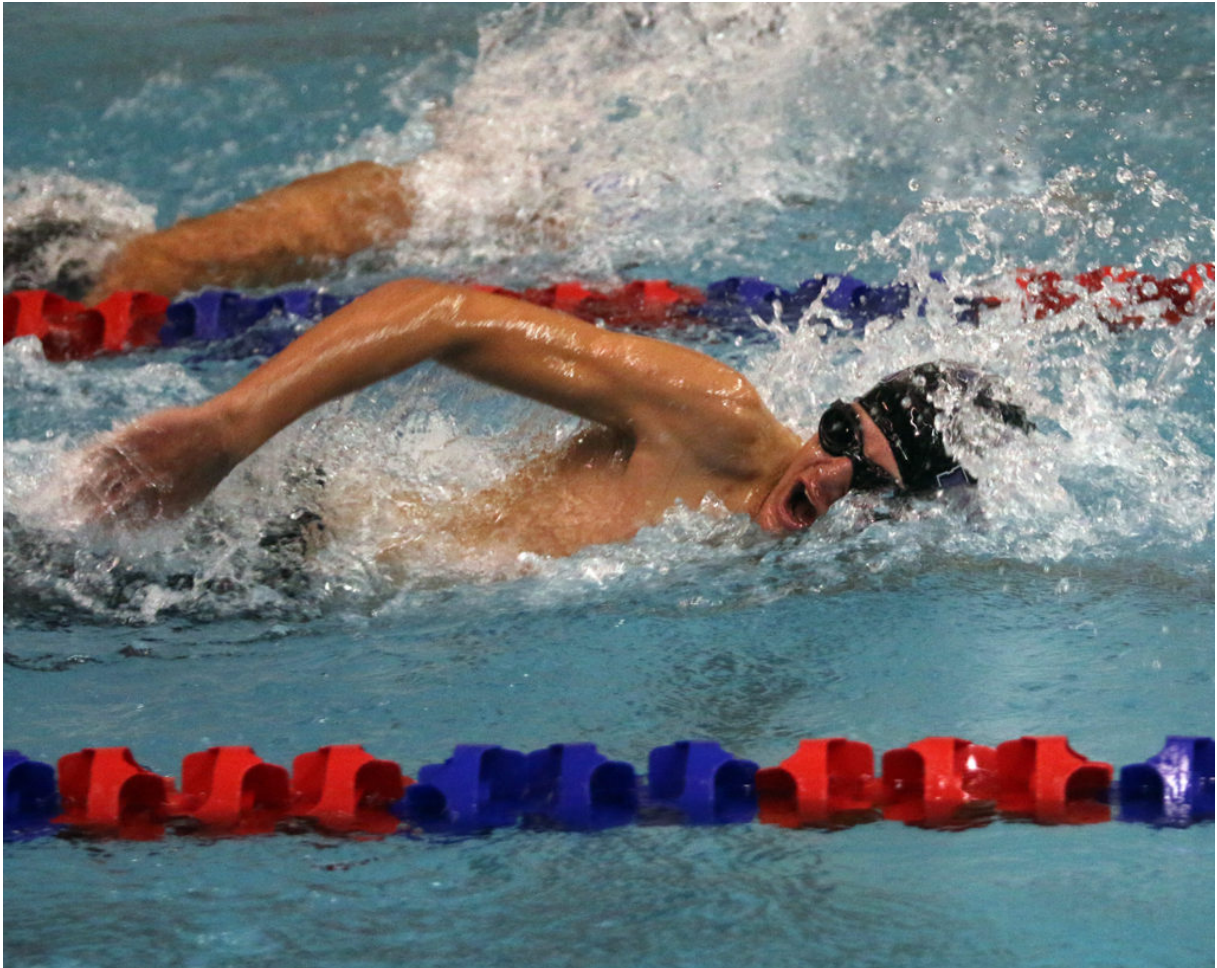
Claire Brown (11-12 girls), Kadisyn Kircher (15-and-over girls) and Samuel Johnson (9-10 boys) each racked up four victories on the day.

Branine had a big day as she won the 50-yard freestyle in 36.22 seconds, 50 breaststroke in 49.64 and 50 backstroke in 42.03. She also joined three others to win a pair of relays. Branine, Lola Dubas, Jesse Faulkner and Hannah Farrington combined to win first-place ribbon in the 100-yard medley relay with a time of 1 minute and 35 seconds, while Branine, Farrington, Faulkner and Ally Brown won the 100 freestyle relay in 1:21.

Prettyman was also a part of two relay victories for the 11-12 girls as she joined Abby Bradley, Claire Brown and Tehya Harvey to win the 200 medley relay (2:42). Prettyman, Bradley, Brown and Dana Mattison won the 200 freestyle relay (2:24). Prettyman also went on to win the 50 butterfly (35.28), 50 backstroke (35.94) and 200 individual medley (2:59).

Carpenter-Ross led the 8-and-under boys with three individual

wins in the 25 butterfly (23.83), 25 backstroke (20.82) and 100 individual medley (1:45). He also helped Colin Brown, Dominick Poetter and Andrew Jamison to a victory in the 100 medley relay (1:48), while Carpenter-Ross, Brown, Jamison and Spencer Mattison won the 100 freestyle relay (1:28).

Barracudas have big day against Butler

In what was its last home meet of the season, the Louisburg Barracuda swim team certainly went out in style.

The Barracudas took care of business Saturday against the Butler Aqua Bears at the Louisburg Aquatic Center. Louisburg defeated Butler 447-55 to improve its record to 3-0 on the season.

Louisburg dominated the waters as it had 14 swimmers that finished with four or more first-place ribbons, while five of those swimmers won all their events.

Cricket McIntire (8-and-under), Ashley Branine (9-10), Emma Prettyman (11-12) each won five events on the girls side, while Josiah McCaskill (9-10) and Davy Brock (15-and-over) captured five victories for the boys.

Claire Brown (11-12), Mary Grace McElyea (13-14), Kadisyn Kircher (15-and-over), Samuel Johnson (9-10), William Goode (11-12), Braden Branine (11-12), Cole Brown (13-14), Remington Rice (13-14) and Christopher Tyson (15-and-over) each had four

wins on the day.

In the 8-and-under girls division, McIntire won the 25-meter freestyle in 21.66 seconds, the 25 breaststroke in 30.54 and 100 individual medley in 2 minutes and 19 seconds. She also joined Ella Bockelman, Shylah Dowell and Meg Johnson to capture the 100 medley relay in 1:56 and 100 freestyle relay in 1:43.

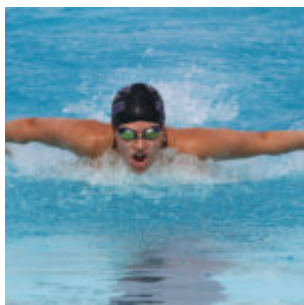

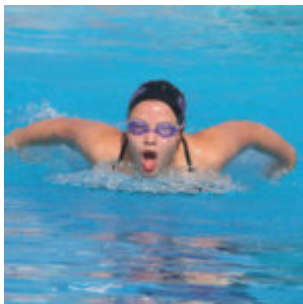
